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55 kilometers of coast, 13 municipalities overlooking the sea, here is the Amalfi Coast.

The entire territory winds along the state road that begins in Colli di San Pietro area (on the hills of the Sorrento Peninsula) ending in Vietri sul Mare.

The Amalfi Coast runs along the entire southern side of the Sorrento Peninsula and includes the municipalities of Positano, Praiano, Furore, Conca dei Marini, Amalfi, Atrani, Ravello, Scala, Tramonti, Minori, Maiori, Cetara and Vietri sul Mare.

Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997, the coast is renowned throughout the world for its natural beauty.

These last and picturesque landscapes have made it, especially since the Second World War, one of the favorite destinations of the world jet set, which has earned it the nickname "Divine Coast".

Being one of the most beautiful places in the world also involves some issues. In the high season, which goes from May to October, the tourist flow of people it is high all year round and this leads to long queues on the road that will take you from the airport to the Amalfi Coast and the very high risk that you will find little availability at the restaurants in the area. Traffic is in fact one of the main problems affecting our locality and local public transport is unable to satisfy the entire tourist demand.

Therefore the best solution is to book a private transfer well in advance to take you to the hotel and to inform our staff in advance of the restaurants where you intend to dine.

The same goes for all the other activities you wish to do.


The availability of private transfers and restaurants will not be guaranteed if you decide to book shortly before your arrival at the hotel.



PALAZZO MURAT

Located on the road leading to the characteristic Spiaggia Grande, the Hotel Palazzo Murat is an enchanting nineteenth-century residence protected by a garden that, with its fresh citrus and Mediterranean scent, pampers you away from everything and everyone. Even if you are exactly in the center of Positano, the pearl of the Amalfi coast.

Palazzo Murat will become the stage of your fairytale holiday, organized down to the smallest detail by our staff, welcoming guests for an aperitif in the wonderful courtyard, enjoying the dishes of our kitchen in restaurant nestled within the botanical garden or by the pool.



The Hotel Palazzo Murat is the result of the perfect combination of privacy and comfort of a private residence, made even more prestigious thanks to the Attanasio Family who for generations has preserved the ancient splendor of the palace with periodic renovations, to offer guests the comforts of a luxury hotel in the heart of Positano.

The origins of Palazzo Murat are associated to the history of Positano itself, a small town on the Amalfi Coast detached for centuries from the rest of the world due to its almost inaccessibility from the ground, and difficulty, given the absence of a port, from the sea routes.

At the end of the nineteenth-early twentieth century, the history of Positano is intertwined with that of the current Palazzo Murat.

When the enterprising Alfonso Cinque from Positano called "the engineer" (for his natural ability, without any academic qualification) decided after spending time in the small town of Positano he would emigrate with his family to New York in the United States. There he made a healthy fortune as a wholesaler, managing to arrange for his brothers as well. Eventually, forced by his wife, he returned to his beloved Positano.

Thanks to his prosperity acquired in America he was able to buy, among other things, the ground floor of the present building, already called Palazzo Murat, where it seems that the then King of Naples Joachim Murat lived, brother-in-law to Napoleon Bonapart married to his sister Carolina. Alfonso also took the adjoining agricultural land and after years of hard work turned it into the garden of wonders of Positano.

A garden including everything from a vineyard, vegetable garden, olive trees, animals, and anything else that could be cultivated at the time, all this while continuing his passion as an "engineer".

This monumental building was built on the ruins of the ancient Church of San Vito, protector of Positano. In turn it was also built on the remains of the Benedictine Abbey, where Pope Benedict XIII and Cardinals such as Federico Borromeo can be counted among the Abbots.

Lastly, that Abbey was built on the lava that had buried the Roman Villa centuries before leaving the Palace atop of two underlying layers, one medieval and one Roman.

OUR HISTORY

After many passing years Alfonso's children grew and asked for their space. To Carlino, one of his sons, he sent to another of his buildings the Miramare, located at the end of the famous Scalinatella, allowing him to do with it as he wished.

It was around the nineteen thirties when Carlino, for us "Zio Carlino", put into action his project to bring tourism to Positano. The beginning was a challenge but thanks to his ability and charm Carlino soon made himself known and loved by all foreigners who passed through Positano. Spontaneously, without school, he learned many languages and amicably conversed with them making Positano a destination of which to return.

Its success spread, especially in England due to the foreign officers traveling to Italy during the liberation after the Second World War. So great was this success that they returned with friends and family to this special place where they had experienced such warmth and hospitality during difficult times. Consequently, after the war Miramare's popularity took off thanks to the welcoming style of Carlino, sister Carmela and her husband Vito Attanasio.

After the death of his father Alfonso, Carlino, Carmela and Vito "our parents" returned to the building where in the following years they completed the purchase of the remaining floors until they became the sole owners. Of course, in the beginning they were only landlords then apartments and finally in the sixties the Palazzo became the Hotel Palazzo Murat.

A special hotel, because it was also a home, our home.

We were six children confused between family life and that of the hotel. Because I was one of the six, I remember, that the needs of the hotel came before ours and the guests came before us children.

When tourism exploded in Positano and times changed, one thing has always remained in our family which is, the wishes of the guests come before those of the family.

It is with this spirit that even today, we of the third generation, have given way to the new generation, the management of Palazzo Murat, which is not solely a hotel but above all, a family in which all our guests are included!

Today it is a pleasure and a duty for our children, Vito, Benedetta and Giuseppe, the fifth generation of the family at the helm of the hotel Palazzo Murat to welcome you, not in the hotel, but rather in our home.



AMALFI

Amalfi is the municipality that gives its name to the entire coast.

A wonderful city, full of charm, which starts from the sea and climbs up the hills.

A destination renowned for its artisan shops, it is a perfect place for a day of shopping and good food. Amalfi is easily reachable from Positano both by sea and by land.

St.Andrew's Cathedral

Place of worship

The Cathedral of Amalfi, with its wonderful bell tower and its steep staircase, contains not only the history of the city, but also its historical openness towards others places and other cultures.

It is therefore not possible to trace a unique architectural style: the current ensemble resembles the architecture Sicilian Arab-Norman, with flashes of baroque and medieval details.

Chiostro del Paradiso

Place of worship

Located on the left of the Cathedral portico, the cloister hosts decorations cosmatesque paintings, frescoes and sarcophagi Romans. To attract attention, however, are above all the unmistakable bows Moorish influences.

Naval Arsenal

Museum

It is a museum on the history of the city, monument of the maritime power of Amalfi. The highlight of the collection, which includes nautical charts, artifacts and compasses, are the Amalfi Tables, a code of rules drawn up in the 11th century which still constitutes the foundation today of maritime law.

Gardens

The gardens have taken on the configuration current since the mid-19th century. The vegetation, exotic flowers and intertwined arches make up a dream scenario. Very famous place for photographs, the belvedere suspended over the sea is one of the symbolic places of the Amalfi Coast.

Gardens

Located on the southern edge of the village this wonderful adorning garden of rose, statues and fountains reaches its maximum expression once you reach the Terrazza dell'Infinito, an amazing terrace overlooking the sea. Splendid place for walking, thanks to the network of paths mostly flat.

St. Francis's Cloister

Place of worship

Located at the entrance to the municipal gardens, the cloister fourteenth-century of the Church of San Francesco it is a jewel of medieval architecture, composed of a portico and arches supported by octagonal columns.

St. Cesareo's alleys

Shopping

It is the most characteristic alleyway in Sorrento, in the heart of the historic centre. An ideal place for shopping for typical products: while the boutiques wind along the main street, in these parts you will find small shops where you can buy liqueurs and locally produced products, such as the very famous limoncello.





It is a natural swimming pool formed inside an inlet on the promontory of Punta Capo, with attached ruins of a Roman villa. This sort of cenote is found 2 km from the center of Sorrento and you can get there either on foot or by bus. The path to get to the bathing bay it's a bit tortuous.

Blue Grotto

Sea spot

The fame and name derive from the incredible blue of the waters inside: when the weather is good, the sea seems illuminated by an underwater light. Entrance to the Blue Grotto takes place with small boats that accommodate a maximum of four people. The wait to enter the cave, especially in high season, can reach up to an hour.

Piazzetta di Capri

Shopping

It is the worldly heart of Capri, the symbol of "la dolce vita".

The excavations of Pompeii they extend for approximately 440,000 square meters: an entire city buried with squares, temples, spas, gyms, houses, restaurants.
